

Exploring new media and its potential in teaching: group activity

Collection: Online teaching

Resource: Designing learning with new media

Approximate duration

60 minutes

Learning outcomes

By the end of this activity participants should have a clearer understanding of the types of new media that can be used effectively in educational contexts like their own, how and where the new media might be used and have a clearer insight into the implications for their teaching of using different types of new media.

Introduction

Depending on the group's experience with using new media you could structure this section in a number of ways.

- Start by showing one of the two videoclips detailed below where English lecturers talk about how they have incorporated different kinds of new media into their teaching. Alternatively your students could watch these clips before they come to the sessions enabling you to...
- Jump directly to the group-related work based on completing a handout.

The activity

Ask the group whether they have used PowerPoint or Facebook in their teaching?
 Undoubtedly many will have used the former so you might like to tease out



- whether they use any of the advanced features of PowerPoint e.g. animations...or whether they encourage their students to use it? If so what kind of feedback did they get from the students?
- 2. Next show a couple of videoclips illustrating how both PowerPoint and Facebook are being used in English studies (Creative Writing & Induction):
 - The first is a short presentation from the digital poet Judy Kendall. Judy describes how she uses *PowerPoint* to teach Digital Poetry on a Creative Writing module at the University of Salford. (http://vimeo.com/23793023)



In the second clip, Ruth Page describes how her department used

Facebook for pre-induction activities online. (http://vimeo.com/23793117)

- 3. After you have shown one or both clips you might like to ask participants what they thought about the techniques being used and whether they might use or adapt any of the ideas for use with their students?
- 4. This group discussion leads to a brainstorming activity where groups discuss the various types of new media that could be used with their students, where they might be used and why. Are there are any challenges or affordances to using it? Below there is a template for a downloadable handout that you might distribute to the participants to help capture their discussions.
